## **STUD BEEF - RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Exhibitors are to have waybills correctly completed and have NLIS tags identifying their cattle. Waybills will be sighted by the appointed Stewards and copies retained by the Show Society. All cattle are to be scanned on arrival at the Marburg Showground in accordance with the National Livestock Identification Scheme. Scanned data will be processed as per guidelines of the National Livestock Identification Scheme.
2. Exhibitors are not to interfere with the work of the Stewards or appointed persons undertaking this activity. The Judges' decision is final.
3. The cut-off date for the age of animals is the 1st May 2022.
4. The owners name, the animals registered stud name, date of birth and the breed of the animal must be clearly printed on the entry form.
5. Animals must be entered in one registered breed only.
6. Animals must be owned by the Exhibitor prior to entering.
7. All Stud Cattle exhibited must be either calf or adult registered to their respective herd book and herd number branded/or tattooed. Proof of registration must be made available on request.
8. The maximum age of a calf on a cow will be nine months as at 1st May, 2022. Any calf shown on a cow is NOT ELIGIBLE to be shown in individual classes.
9. Cattle must be tick free to protect animals from non-tick areas.
10. All bulls 12 months and over MUST have a NOSE RING. Other young animals must be haltered and may have a nose dog/clip.
11. Exhibitors are required to wear protective footwear and are to have enough handlers to prevent unnecessary delay during judging.
12. To be eligible to lead an animal in the Grand Parade, children under the age of 12 years must be accompanied by an adult over 18 years.
13. If in the opinion of the Judge, the cattle exhibited are not worthy of a prize, no prize shall be given.
14. There is no discussion between Judges and Exhibitors before or during judging.
15. All ribbon winners must remain on the grounds until they have taken part in the Grand Parade.
16. EXHIBITORS: Demonstrate to patrons that you are proud of your cattle. Make sure they are in the Grand Parade.
17. ALL EXHIBITORS TO PAY GATE ADMISSION FEES. 16. SECTIONS: There will be three sections: BRITISH BREEDS; TROPICAL BREEDS and EUROPEAN BREEDS. All breeds are accepted.
18. Where one entry only occurs in a class the animal will be judged at champion level.
19. Stewards have the right to remove any animal from the judging ring, public area, including stalls, if the animal dangerous to others safety.
20. Chief Steward had the power to remove exhibitors or other persons from the vicinity of the judge while judging.

21. A protest by exhibitor must be lodged in writing, with \$100.00 fee, with the Steward in Charge within 30 minutes of the completion of event.
22. All persons causing a nuisance, after being cautioned, will be expelled from the Showgrounds. If it is exhibitors they may be disqualified.
23. Exhibitors shall at all times behave in a proper and courteous manner to Judges, Show Officials and other exhibitors.
24. Should an exhibitor behave in an offensive or improper manner; the chief Steward has the right to exclude and disqualify that exhibitor.
25. Exhibitors/competitors are to have no personalised advertising displayed when parading animals before the judge.
26. In Stud Beef rings, Dust Coats must be work or Breed Society approved uniform only for the judging of all handler classer.
27. All electrical equipment being brought onto the grounds is required to be fitted with earth leak circuit breakers.
28. All Electrical Leads and appliances are currently tagged by a licensed electrical contractor.
29. Any competitor who receives any physical or electronic communication aid during the judging of an event will have nominations cancelled.
30. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, the Marburg Show Society cannot accept any responsibility for losses or damage to livestock or property.
31. The administration of drugs is prohibited as per QCAS Rules or exhibitors must have Statuary Declaration signed by a Veterinary Surgeon.
32. For General Rules for Stud Beef Cattle concerning Conduct, Judging Rules and Stewards Guide Lines, please Contact the Chief Steward. NOTE CATTLE TREATMENT FOR STOCK RETURNING TO CLEAN AREAS:
  - ❖ Marburg Show Grounds does not have an approved livestock spraying facility. Exhibitors returning to the Cattle Tick protected and fee areas will need to contact the DPI and book in for a return treatment at one of their clearing centres. A minimum of 48 hours' notice is required.
  - ❖ Clearing centres are located at: Helidon – 07 4697 6204. Aratula – 07 5463 1188. Coolabunia - 07 4160 0700. Bedding is supplied.

## **YOUNG JUDGES COMPETITION:**

- The Young Judges Competition will be conducted on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> May, 2022
- Entry is FREE
- The winner will represent the Marburg Show in the Sub-Chamber final to be held at a selected Show in 2022.
- Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Young Judges Rules will apply. RULES
- ❖ Open to persons under the age of 25 years as at 1st May 2022.
- ❖ Competitors under the age of 18 years must have approval of parent or guardian to attend and it is the responsibility of parent or guardian to make arrangements on behalf of the Competitor.
- ❖ All Competitors to be resident in Queensland for at least three months prior to the competition, or be attending a college in Queensland.
- ❖ Eligibility – National winners and Judges are not eligible.
  - ❖ A competitor can represent only one Show Society in any sub-chamber final and only one sub-chamber in the state final.
  - ❖ Young Judges under the age of 15 years are not eligible to enter state final.
  - ❖ A show winner is not eligible to win at any other show but may participate after informing the Steward of previous win.
  - ❖ Entries for the Young Judges Competition are taken on the morning of the Show. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Places will receive ribbons.

## **PARADERS:**

A Beef Young Paraders Competition will be conducted under the following QCAS RULES Four age groups: Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> May, 2022

- ❖ Open to persons under the age of 25 years as at 1st May 2022.
- ❖ Competitors under the age of 18 years must have approval of parent or guardian to attend and it is the responsibility of parent or guardian to make arrangements on behalf of the Competitor.
- ❖ All Competitors to be resident in Queensland for at least three months prior to the competition, or be attending a college in Queensland.
- ❖ Entrants residing over the border who can prove an affinity with a Queensland show, are allowed entry by satisfying one of the following criteria: their address has a Queensland postcode; they have a Queensland phone number; or the entrant or their parents are active working members of that show.
- ❖ Eligibility – National winners and Judges are not eligible.
- ❖ A competitor can represent only one Show Society in any sub-chamber final and only one sub-chamber in the state final.
- ❖ Beef Cattle Young Paraders - Sub-Chamber Final will be held at a selected Show in 2022.
- ❖ ENTRIES for the Beef Cattle Young Paraders Competition will be taken on the morning of the Show
- ❖ Competition Entry is FREE 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Places will receive Prize Ribbons.

### **RULES**

- ❖ All Led Steers/Heifers must be Milk Tooth and must be owned by Exhibitor prior to show.
- ❖ All Steers will be weighed at 7am.
- ❖ All entries must be named and the dominant breed to be listed on entry form.
- ❖ Exhibitors are required to have enough handlers to prevent unnecessary delay during judging.
- ❖ The winner of the Champion Led Steer is automatically eligible for the West Moreton & Brisbane Valley Show Circuit Final Prize in 2022.

Class 25 .....Light Steer – Maximum Live Weight 370kg

Class 26 .....Medium Steer – 371kg – 425kg

Class 27..... Heavy Steer – 426kg and over

Class 28 .....Heifer – Open Weight – not to be entered in Stud Classes
