SPECIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

All Exhibitors attending the Show are to pay Admission Fees. All prizes awarded at the Show must be collected on the day or as soon as possible in cases where there is a protest. All prizes not collected will be forfeited to the Association. Prize-winners of over \$50.00 (Forms available from Treasurer's Office) GST registered prize winners claim GST on prize money by issuing a Tax Invoice including A.B.N. or Hobbyists form must be filled in OR 48.5% will be withheld. A copy of these rules may be seen in the Treasurer's Office.

To be eligible to lead or ride on an animal, children under the age of 11 years must be accompanied by an adult.

BIOSECURITY RULES:

- ❖ Marburg Show Society suggests that all horses entered are currently vaccinated against Hendra Virus however this is not compulsory.
- ❖ All people bringing livestock onto event grounds are expected to be aware of their biosecurity obligations which is that they must take all responsible steps to ensure activities do not spread pests, disease or contaminants.
- ❖ They are advised that:
 - No animals with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
 - They are responsible for cleaning up manure and placing in designated areas.
 - Competitors are required to advise Event Organisers immediately of sick animals, and they are to stop all non-essential contact with sick animals, ensuring that children do not have close contact.
 - Everyone handling animals should wash or sanitise hands between contact with other animals.
 - Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all Horse exhibitors.
 - Property Identification codes (PIC) of origin and destination must be on HHDs.
 - Acceptance into the event will be refused if an HHD is not presented at designated registration point.
 - No communal horse water troughs will be available at the event. Equipment, including food and water containers are not to be shared between horses.
- ❖ Any person in care of a horse or horses, whether competing or not, must, on entering the Showgrounds, complete and present a Horse Health Declaration (HHD) for each horse at Treasurer's Office. The Property Identification code (PIC) for the Marburg Showgrounds is QGIW 1059.
- ❖ Each competitor, when nominating for events, must hand to the Nominations Steward a signed QCAS waiver form.
- ❖ All riders enter these events at their own risk. Neither the organizing committee, nor the Marburg Show Society accepts any responsibility to any person, horse or property however caused.
- ❖ All horse at Marburg Show must be tick free.

CONDITIONS:

- E.A. rules apply in all Hacking and Showjumping events.
- Horses entered in any class to be measured at the discretion of the stewards.
- Horses entered in any class may be swabbed at the discretion of the stewards. EA Rules will apply.
- The ring committee reserves the right to change the sequence of events at its discretion.
- Competitors are expected to check the rings and be on time for their respective classes.
- An exhibitor shall ensure that horse and competitor are entered and shown only in the correct classes. Penalties will be incurred at the Society's discretion should be rule be violated.
- The judge's decision shall be final. No competitor or exhibitor shall approach a judge regarding a decision, unless they first obtain permission from the Chief Steward or Ring Steward.
- Top boots may be worn by riders under 17 years in rider Classes.
- EA Approved Safety Helmets are compulsory for riders under 17 years.
- All animal handlers are required to wear Protective footwear.
- Persons and animals, who by their actions, present a risk to themselves or others will be directed by the Steward to leave the Ring.
- MAIDEN: Maiden Hack/Rider is one that has never won first prize as a hack/rider at a provincial show in Open or District Classes.
- NOVICE: Novice Hack is one that has not won an Open or District Championship as a hack at a Provincial Show.
- Colt and Stallions handlers must be at least 18 years of age.

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT 1995 AND ELECTRICAL SAFETY ACT 2002- Any exhibitors or persons attending the Show must ensure they comply with the provisions of these Acts. Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor and have a current tag attached. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the Public. This is a requirement under the provisions of the Electrical Safety Act 2002 and Marburg District Agricultural and Industrial Association Inc. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Marburg Show Grounds. Exhibitors should check all electrical equipment and leads before coming to the Showgrounds to avoid the occurrence of any difficulties. If necessary, a certified electrician will be on the grounds to carry out an inspection and tagging, however, there will be a charge for this service.

N.B. All persons entering the show ring do so at their own risk. Small children and persons, who by their actions present a risk to themselves and / or others, will be directed by the stewards to leave the ring.

Ridden Classes

18. Donkey/Mule under saddle.
19. Donkey/Mule ridden obstacle class.
20. Donkey/Mule Youth rider class 17 years and under
21. Donkey/Mule Adult rider class 18 years and over.
